Observation Checkpoints

At around 12 months, can the baby pull to stand from a sitting position and sit down? Or at approximately six months sit unsupported on the floor.

At around 18mths can a toddler put pieces of a simple toy together, fitting objects one inside the other or by themselves become involved in creating a simple construction by piling objects one on top of the other.
