

Southglade Park



Healthy walks in Nottingham City's parks & open spaces

Points of interest:

- Walks with some gradients, giving good views ranging from “the chimneys” at Nuthall in the northwest to the Radcliffe-on-Soar Power Station and the city in the south
- Many of the hedges on site are well over 100 years old. These are remnants of the boundaries to the fields that used to lie between Top Valley Farm and Southglade Farm, before Top Valley estate and Southglade Park were built
- Entrance archway features designed by local school children
- The wooded area along Route 1 is a haven for wildlife, with a number of species of birds using it for feeding and roosting including Green Woodpeckers and Kestrels
- New skate park
- Leisure centre on site includes: café, toilets, swimming pool, sports halls, gym and all weather sports pitches
- Children's play area
- On-site Sure Start Access Centre and Housing Office
