Healthy walks in Nottingham City's parks & open spaces

Points of interest:

- The original aviaries were built during 1890/1 and the circular aviary was built in 1892. One of the first birds introduced into the aviaries was a Sulphur-Crested Cockatoo named 'Cocky' who lived to be 114 years old
- The Victorian flowerbed was refurbished in 2001 and the design and species mix in this bed is varied regularly
- The bandstand was moved from the grounds of Nottingham Castle in 1881, and was placed in its current position in 1915. The bandstand plays host to a number of performances throughout the summer
- The Bell tower was constructed in 1862-3 and commemorates two unrelated military campaigns. The Crimean War of 1854-6 and the China War of 1856-60
- There is a tree trail around the Arboretum which signposts a variety of trees around the park; a leaflet with a map of the tree locations and information is available from www.nottinghamcity.gov.uk/parks

Access via: Waverley Street, gate at the junction of Waverley Street and Arboretum Street, Addison Street, and North Sherwood Street.

Route 1


Approx 1380 steps
just under 1km
(over ½ mile)

Route 2

Approx 1850 steps
1¼ km (over ¾ mile)

Both routes are on hard surfaced paths. One or two steep slopes



Parking for two hours in Arboretum Street. Easy to reach by the tram to the High School - walk down Waverley Street to reach the park

Toilets available during events only, the nearest public toilets can be found at Victoria Shopping Centre (10 minutes walk)
