NOTTINGHAM'S MEADOWS and FIELDS of St. Mary's Parish were not inclosed until 1845. Parliament had just passed an Act allowing future inclosures to give around 10% of the open land to the inhabitants, who were losing their

around the

and

previous free access.

Because of this 122 acres of Public Walks and Recreation Grounds were created, and 8 acres were also given to two cemetenes, 4 for dissenter and 4 for C. of E. burials. These are the allotments for public recreation, 130 acres in all.

The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses seem to have set about their task with energy and enthusiasm, taking the maximum acreage allowed for this purpose, and doing all the work to a high standard, taking the best advice. The town took a pride in its new possession.

The more formal parts were laid out and opened officially, but the facilities on the Forest must have continued in use after 1845 much as they had before. This park, therefore, can be said to date from 1845.
