

Lenton Recreation Ground



Healthy walks in Nottingham City's parks & open spaces

Points of interest:

- The old barn by the bowling greens pre-dates the park and can be seen on maps dated c.1884
- Some specimen and other mature trees date back to the parks origin in 1887 and possibly further back to when the park was still farmland
- Lenton Recreation Ground occupies 6 acres of land and was opened in 1888
- The lodge was constructed in 1906 and was traditionally occupied by an on-site gardener/grounds man
- Bowling Greens have been a feature of the park since 1910
- Play equipment was introduced to the park in 1949 in two areas; one next to the lodge where it still exists today and the other was the space the basketball area occupies
- Club House dates back to 1977 and is currently home to four bowling teams
- Children's play area with modern equipment
- Basketball area with 2 practice zones
- Picnic tables throughout the park
- Original ornamental bandstand
- Field of Hope - daffodil field adjacent to the basketball area

Approx 810 steps
